# Owner asks telecommunications operator to remove base stations

Can a telecom operator report a base station as "did not exist"?

Telecom operators are allowed to report a base station as "did not exist" if the particular site is under repair or decommissioned. In a bid to bring in more transparency, TRAI has asked telecom operators to give details about active base stations and those which are decommissioned.

When do telecom operators need to report a decommissioned base station?

Operators have been told to furnish these details within twenty one days after the end of every quarter. TRAI requires telecom operators to report active, decommissioned base stations, connectivity type, and 5G stations for transparency.

What is a radio base station reconfiguration procedure?

This procedure outlines the application procedure to be followed by the mobile services operators (hereinafter called the "operators") for the reconfiguration of existing radio base stations NOT involving changes in the structural design and planning perspective of the parent building, and the change of land use.

Can a telecoms operator impose a tenancy on a mast site?

Operators will not have a second bite of the cherry! In a recent case, the Upper Tribunal considered whether telecoms operators can seek an order imposing a tenancy of a mast site under the Electronic Communication Code, following an unsuccessful application under the Landlord and Tenant Act 1954.
